## SPECIAL BIO-SECURITY REGULATIONS

### Applicable to Sheep and Cattle Classes.

1. Clean clothing, or clothing which is capable of being cleansed and disinfected, must be worn.

3. All exhibitors must arrange the licences appropriate to the rules in force at the time of the Show.

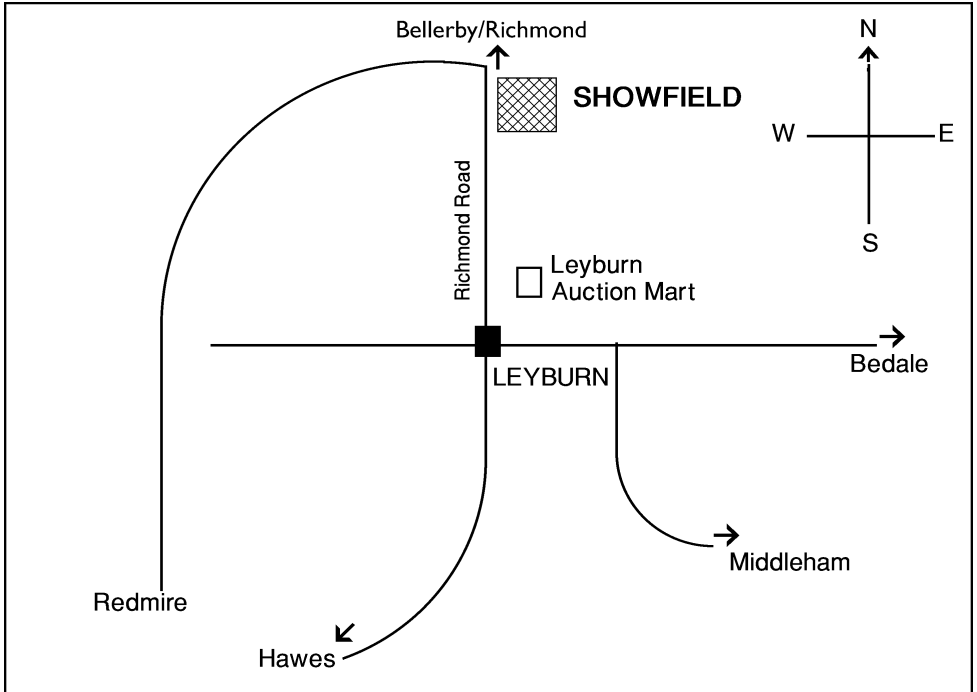

# GENERAL RULES

1. The Wensleydale Agricultural Society Ltd is managed by a board of directors elected by the members.
2. The annual show is organised by the show committee consisting of the President, Committee, Treasurer, Secretaries and Members. The President, Vice-President, Committee, Treasurer and Secretaries to be elected annually at the General Meeting.
3. The Committee shall consist of not less than 15 members who shall have the entire management of the Society, subject to the existing Rules, and five shall form a quorum. The elected Committee to have power to co-opt additional members.
4. The Chairman, Treasurer and Secretaries shall be ex-officio members of all Committees.
5. Annual Subscriptions shall become due and payable on the first day of June in each year. Subscriptions remaining unpaid on August 1st in each year shall be considered in arrear.
6. A member who is in arrears with their subscriptions shall not vote at any meeting of the Society, nor enjoy any of its privileges.
7. Members will receive three admission tickets.
8. Any exhibitor paying more than £5 in entry fees will be allowed one free admission ticket per £5 of entry fee. Children who enter automatically qualify for a child entrance ticket.
9. The Annual General Meeting shall be held each year in the Leyburn area.
10. The Committee shall compile the Annual Prize List, and are empowered to make Rules and Bye-Laws necessary for the Annual Show.
11. The Judges shall not award any prize unless exhibits are deemed worthy and no second prize shall be awarded unless there are three entries in a class, except where the Judge specially recommend a prize be awarded. The Committee reserve the right to amalgamate classes if entries are less than three.
12. All objections must be made to the Secretary, and a deposit of £10 paid, within seven days of the close of the Show, when the Committee will decide, and should the objection be ruled by the Committee to be frivolous the £10 shall be forfeited to the funds of the Show.
13. Should any prize have been forfeited through a protest against the exhibit to which it was awarded, such prize will, in all cases, be paid to the next in merit duly qualified, if distinguished by the Judges.
14. The exhibits will only be admitted between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9.45 a.m. except Handicrafts and Homecrafts (See Special Rules Handicraft and Homecraft Section) after which no exhibit will be allowed to enter under any pretext whatever, and no exhibit will be allowed to leave the ground before 4.30 p.m. except by permission of the Secretary.
15. All matters upon which a question of dispute or doubt shall arise not provided for in the Rules of the Society or in the conditions attached to any prize, shall be referred to the Committee, whose decision shall be final and binding on all parties interested.
16. The Society will not be held responsible for any accident that may occur through or to any exhibit at the Show.
17. No entrance tickets will be sent to members who have not paid their subscriptions.
18. Local classes are confined to entrants residing within a ten mile radius of Leyburn Market Place or within the remaining catchment area of the River Ure to the west. However all classes are open unless otherwise stated.
19. It is the responsibility of the trophy recipients to have the item engraved if they so wish.

# AGRICULTURAL SECTIONS

## Special Rules and General Show Yard Regulations

1. No livestock entered in classes where prizes are offered can be admitted to the exhibition unless a written Certificate of Entry has been received by the Secretary on or before 11th August up to which date entries and subscriptions will be received by the Secretary, and no Certificate of Entry will be accepted unless the entrance fees or subscriptions are then paid.
2. Every exhibitor of stock will be allowed free tickets to the Show Field for Attendants on Animals, or Pens of Animals, according to entry, at the discretion of the Secretary (max 2).
3. All stock must be bona-fide property of the exhibitor on the day of the Show.
4. Any exhibitor bringing any animal in the Show Yard affected with any contagious disorder, shall, on proof thereof forfeit ten pounds to the Secretary for the use of the Society, and any exhibitor removing stock before the close of the Show without the consent of the Secretary, or giving false or incorrect information, shall forfeit every unpaid prize and all entrance money, and be debarred from the Society's Show for three years.
5. If you wish to enter Sheep from a scrapie monitored flock, please contact the Secretary.
6. The Society will make the best arrangements in their power for the accommodation and safety of the public but will not be responsible for loss arising from accident or otherwise. Exhibitors are reminded that it is their responsibility to insure against damage caused by their animals.
7. Animal handlers are responsible for any damage caused by their animals, the show accepts no responsibility or liability for any such damage. Furthermore the show expects all animal handlers under the age of 16 to be accompanied at all times by a responsible adult when moving or showing animals at the show.

## GENERAL NOTES

- (a) Cows or Heifers calving at the Show or which have any signs of discharge must be reported to the Veterinary Officer and will be placed in isolation and returned to the herd of origin as soon as practicable. If calving takes place or abdominal discharge occurs before the time of judging such animals will not be allowed to compete.
- (b) Where private tests for Brucellosis have been carried out on any animal in Scheme Herds, copies of the test certificate or laboratory report must be sent to the Divisional Veterinary Officer.
- (c) No animal will be admitted to the Show unless accompanied by the correct papers.
- (d) Herd Book No. and Name of animal must be submitted for pedigree animals on entry form.
- (e) Substitutes will be allowed, subject to details of the substituted animals being provided.
- (f) Animals which calve or show evidence of calving whilst at the showground must be placed in the approved isolation accommodation pending their possible early removal from the showground.
- (g) Where an animal calves at full term, and the owner arranges for a blood sample and a vaginal swab to be taken and examined at an approved laboratory, and the Rose Bengal Plate Test (RBPT) and microscopical examination of a smear made from the vaginal swab are negative, the animal may return to the show lines at the discretion of the show secretary.
- (h) Where an animal calves prematurely or aborts, the DVO must be informed immediately. The animal must be returned home. TOGETHER WITH ALL OTHER SHOW ANIMALS FROM THE SAME REGISTERED PREMISES after a full range of samples (including, if at all possible, a placental smear) has been taken. The suspect animals must be isolated during transit.
