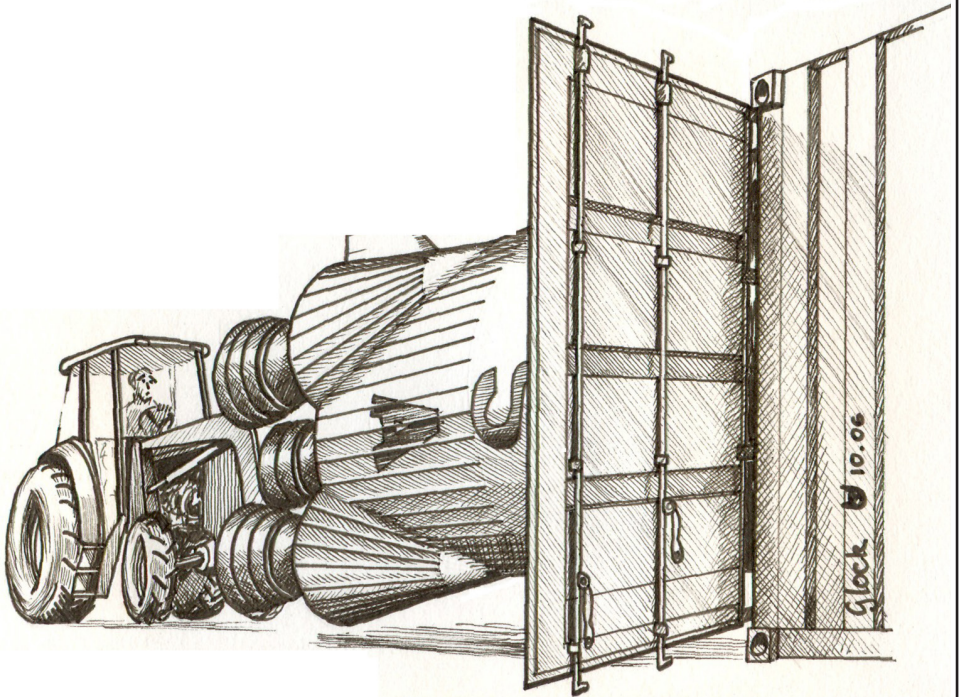

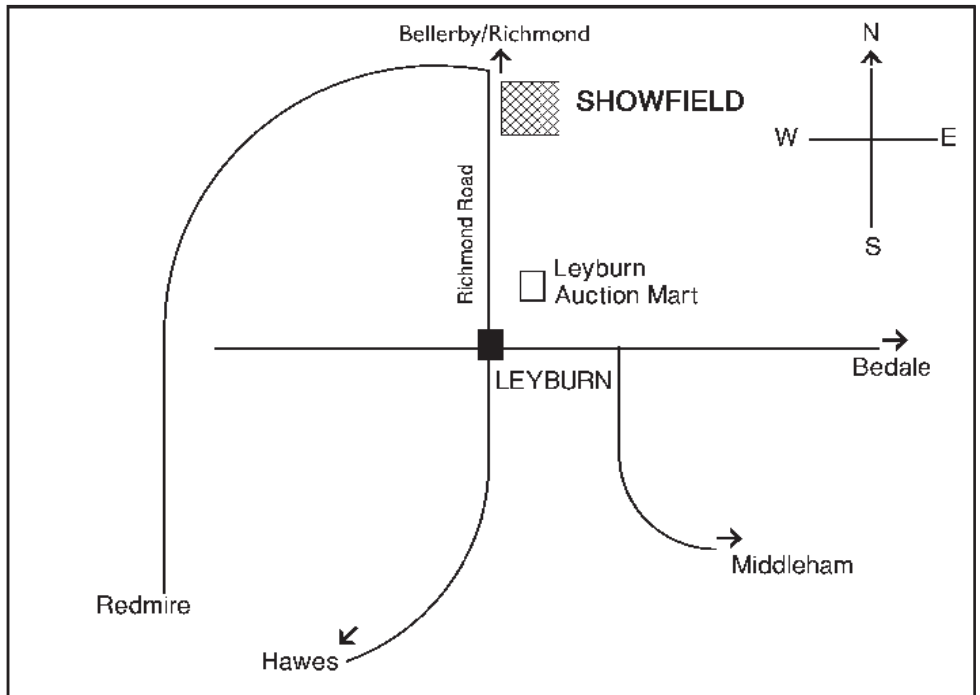

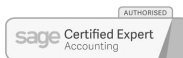

GENERAL RULES

1. The Wensleydale Agricultural Society Ltd is managed by a board of directors elected by the members.
2. The annual show is organised by the show committee consisting of the President, Committee, Treasurer, Secretaries and Members. The President, Vice-President, Committee, Treasurer and Secretaries to be elected annually at the General Meeting.
3. The Committee shall consist of not less than 15 members who shall have the entire management of the Society, subject to the existing Rules, and five shall form a quorum. The elected Committee have power to co-opt additional members.
4. The Chairman, Treasurer and Secretaries shall be ex-officio members of all Committees.
5. Annual Subscriptions shall become due and payable on the first day of June in each year. Subscriptions remaining unpaid on August 1st in each year shall be considered in arrears.
6. A member who is in arrears with their subscriptions shall not vote at any meeting of the Society, nor enjoy any of its privileges.
7. Members will receive three admission tickets.
8. Exhibitors will be allocated tickets in accordance with their section (as stated on entry forms), at the discretion of the Secretary. Children entering the Young Peoples Section will qualify for a child's entrance ticket provided that the child has entered three or more classes.
9. The Annual General Meeting shall be held each year in the Leyburn area.
10. The Committee shall compile the Annual Prize List and are empowered to make Rules and Bye-Laws necessary for the Annual Show.
11. The Judges shall not award any prize unless exhibits are deemed worthy and no second prize shall be awarded unless there are three entries in a class, except where the Judges specially recommend a prize be awarded. The Committee reserves the right to amalgamate classes if are less than three entries.
12. All objections must be made to the Secretary, and a deposit of £10 paid, within seven days of the close of the Show, when the Committee will decide, and should the objection be ruled by the Committee to be frivolous the £10 shall be forfeited to the funds of the Show.
13. Should any prize have been forfeited through a protest against the exhibit to which it was awarded, such prize will, in all cases, be paid to the next in merit duly qualified, if distinguished by the Judges.
14. The exhibits (excluding sheep and cattle) will only be admitted between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9.45 a.m after which no exhibit will be allowed to enter under any pretext whatever, and no exhibit will be allowed to leave the ground before 4.30 p.m. except by permission of the Secretary.
15. All matters upon which a question of dispute or doubt shall arise not provided for in the Rules of the Society or in the conditions attached to any prize, shall be referred to the Committee, whose decision shall be final and binding on all interested parties.
16. The Society will not be held responsible for any accident that may occur through or to any exhibit at the Show.
17. No entrance tickets will be sent to members who have not paid their subscriptions.
18. Local classes are confined to entrants residing within a ten-mile radius of Leyburn Market Place or within the remaining catchment area of the River Ure to the west. However, all classes are open unless otherwise stated.
19. It is the responsibility of the trophy recipients to have the item engraved if they wish.
20. The Show Committee reserves the right to change or cancel any aspect of the show without any notification.

LIVESTOCK, POULTRY AND OTHER ANIMALS

Special Rules and General Show Yard Regulations

- L1. No animals entered in classes where prizes are offered can be admitted to the Show unless a complete Entry form accompanied by the required fee has been received by the Secretary on or before the Entries closing date.
- L2. Every exhibitor of stock will be allowed free tickets to the Show Field for Attendants on Animals, or Pens of Animals, according to entry, at the discretion of the Secretary.
- L3. All stock must be bona-fide property of the exhibitor on the day of the Show.
- L4. Any exhibitor removing stock before the closing of the Show without the consent of the Secretary, or giving false or incorrect information, shall forfeit every unpaid prize and all entrance money, and be debarred from the Society's Show for three years.
- L5. The Society will make the best arrangements in their power for the accommodation and safety of the public but will not be responsible for loss arising from accident or otherwise. Exhibitors are reminded that it is their responsibility to insure against damage caused by their animals.
- L6. Exhibitors must have full public liability insurance as they are wholly responsible for any damage or injury caused by their animals or machinery. The show does not accept any responsibility or liability for any such damage or injury. Furthermore, the show expects all animal handlers under the age of 16 to be accompanied at all times by a responsible adult when moving or showing animals at the show.
- L7. All bulls must be double tied in the Marquee.
- L8. Classes in all sections may be amalgamated or split by the Stewards if insufficient or excessive entries.
- L9. Cattle showing signs of calving or aborting must be reported to the Society Veterinary surgeon immediately who will advise - the animal may be placed in isolation and returned to its herd of origin. The animal will not be allowed to enter.
- L10. No animal will be admitted to the Show unless accompanied by the correct papers. – All livestock must be accompanied by their passport or movement licence and it is the exhibitor's responsibility to follow all movement licensing and testing requirements and disease regulations current at the time of travelling to and from the show.
- L11. Ear tag No and Name of animal must be stated for pedigree animals on entry form.
- L12. Substitutes within the same class may be allowed, subject to details of the substituted animals being provided by the entry's secretary (sandy@wensleydaleshow.org.uk) in advance of Show Day.
- L13. Clean clothing or clothing capable of being cleansed and disinfected must be worn.
- L14. All poultry must return in the original holding at the end of the Show.
- L15. No vehicle or outside person will enter or leave the animal area visibly contaminated with animal faeces.
Hand and boot washing facilities and foot dips are provided.

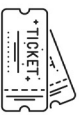

HORSE AND PONY CLASSES

No entries accepted on the day

Hunter and Light Horses Rules for Competitors

1. Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following Current Safety Standards/Specifications Must be worn by all riders when mounted. PASO15 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 & 2023, SNELL E2016 onwards, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards.
2. Junior riders U16 on the day, must wear a correctly fitted, approved body protector whilst mounted.
3. Horses and Ponies must be four years old on the first of January 2026 in order to be mounted on the show ground.
4. Riders must be four years old or over on the first of January 2026.
5. Riders competing in lead rein classes must only compete on the lead rein for the duration of the show, the exception being first ridden classes.
6. All horses and ponies receiving a new primary course of vaccinations from 1 January 2026 must be vaccinated according to this schedule:
 - initial primary course of two vaccinations (V1 and V2) must be given: the second vaccination (V2) must be administered within 21-60 days of the first initial vaccination (V1)
 - Horses may attend activities 7 full days after receiving the second vaccination of the primary course (V2).
 - A first booster vaccination (V3) must be administered within 120 – 180 days of the administration of the second vaccination of the primary course.
 - Thereafter booster vaccinations must be administered at a maximum of 12 months intervals.Horses and ponies must not attend activities within 7 days of receiving any vaccination. 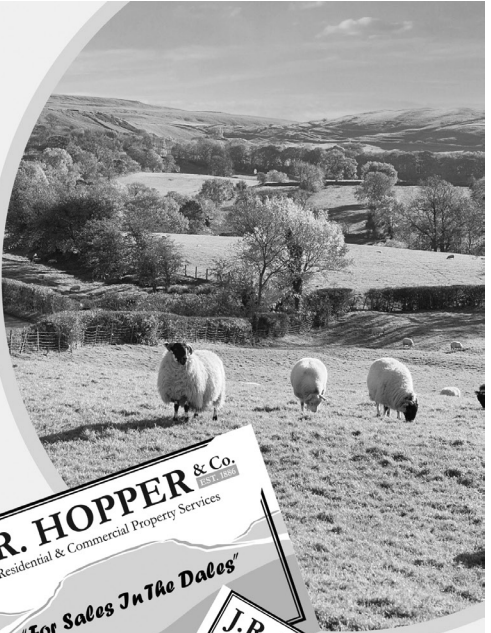

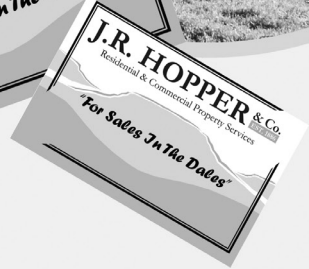
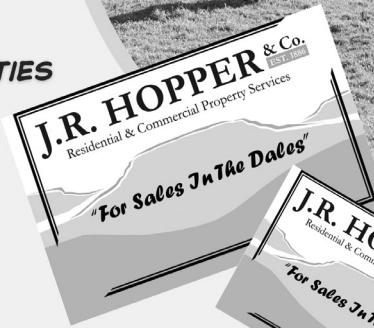
