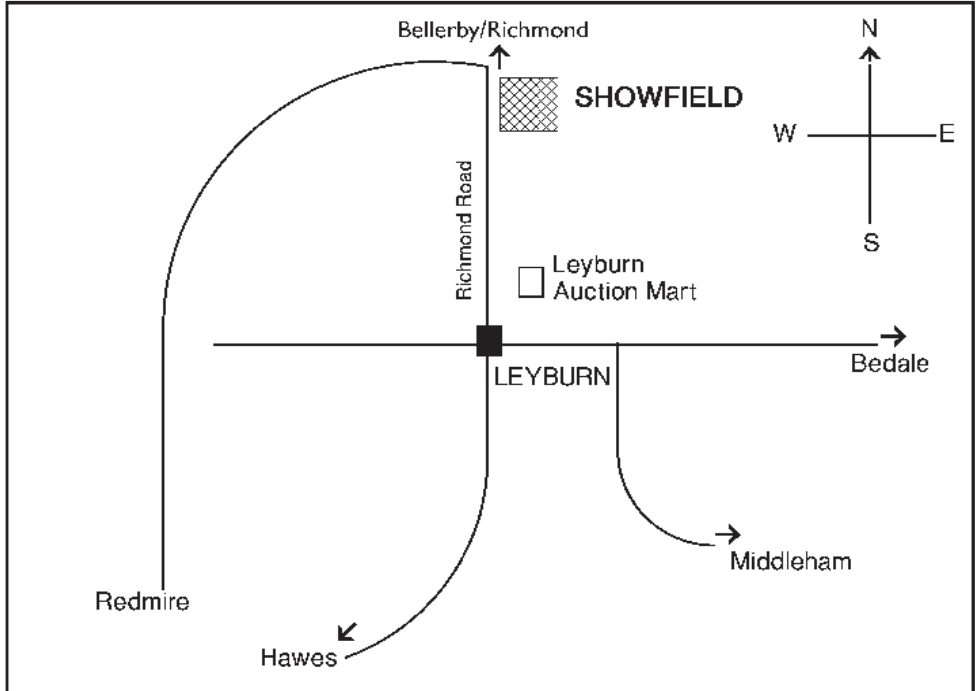

GENERAL RULES

1. The Wensleydale Agricultural Society Ltd is managed by a board of directors elected by the members.
2. The annual show is organised by the show committee consisting of the President, Committee, Treasurer, Secretaries and Members. The President, Vice-President, Committee, Treasurer and Secretaries to be elected annually at the General Meeting.
3. The Committee shall consist of not less than 15 members who shall have the entire management of the Society, subject to the existing Rules, and five shall form a quorum. The elected Committee to have power to co-opt additional members.
4. The Chairman, Treasurer and Secretaries shall be ex-officio members of all Committees.
5. Annual Subscriptions shall become due and payable on the first day of June in each year. Subscriptions remaining unpaid on August 1st in each year shall be considered in arrear.
6. A member who is in arrears with their subscriptions shall not vote at any meeting of the Society, nor enjoy any of its privileges.
7. Members will receive three admission tickets.
8. Exhibitors will be allocated tickets in accordance with their section (as stated on entry forms), at the discretion of the Secretary. Children entering the Young Peoples Section will qualify for a child's entrance ticket provided that the child has entered three or more classes.
9. The Annual General Meeting shall be held each year in the Leyburn area.
10. The Committee shall compile the Annual Prize List, and are empowered to make Rules and Bye-Laws necessary for the Annual Show.
11. The Judges shall not award any prize unless exhibits are deemed worthy and no second prize shall be awarded unless there are three entries in a class, except where the Judges specially recommend a prize be awarded. The Committee reserve the right to amalgamate classes if entries are less than three.
12. All objections must be made to the Secretary, and a deposit of £10 paid, within seven days of the close of the Show, when the Committee will decide, and should the objection be ruled by the Committee to be frivolous the £10 shall be forfeited to the funds of the Show.
13. Should any prize have been forfeited through a protest against the exhibit to which it was awarded, such prize will, in all cases, be paid to the next in merit duly qualified, if distinguished by the Judges.
14. The exhibits (excluding sheep and cattle) will only be admitted between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9.45 a.m after which no exhibit will be allowed to enter under any pretext whatever, and no exhibit will be allowed to leave the ground before 4.30 p.m. except by permission of the Secretary.
15. All matters upon which a question of dispute or doubt shall arise not provided for in the Rules of the Society or in the conditions attached to any prize, shall be referred to the Committee, whose decision shall be final and binding on all interested parties.
16. The Society will not be held responsible for any accident that may occur through or to any exhibit at the Show.
17. No entrance tickets will be sent to members who have not paid their subscriptions.
18. Local classes are confined to entrants residing within a ten mile radius of Leyburn Market Place or within the remaining catchment area of the River Ure to the west. However all classes are open unless otherwise stated.
19. It is the responsibility of the trophy recipients to have the item engraved if they so wish.
20. The Show Committee reserve the right to change or cancel any aspect of the show without any notification.

LIVESTOCK AND ANIMAL SECTIONS

Special Rules and General Show Yard Regulations

1. No animals entered in classes where prizes are offered can be admitted to the Show unless a written Entry form accompanied with the required fee has been received by the Secretary on or before the Entries closing date.
2. Every exhibitor of stock will be allowed free tickets to the Show Field for Attendants on Animals, or Pens of Animals, according to entry, at the discretion of the Secretary.
3. All stock must be bona-fide property of the exhibitor on the day of the Show.
4. Any exhibitor bringing any animal in the Show Yard affected with any contagious disorder, shall, on proof thereof forfeit ten pounds to the Secretary for the use of the Society.
5. Any exhibitor removing stock before the close of the Show without the consent of the Secretary, or giving false or incorrect information, shall forfeit every unpaid prize and all entrance money, and be debarred from the Society's Show for three years.
6. If you wish to enter Sheep from a scrapie monitored flock, please contact the Secretary.
7. The Society will make the best arrangements in their power for the accommodation and safety of the public but will not be responsible for loss arising from accident or otherwise. Exhibitors are reminded that it is their responsibility to insure against damage caused by their animals.
8. Exhibitors must have full public liability insurance as they are wholly responsible for any damage or injury caused by their animals or machinery. The show does not accept any responsibility or liability for any such damage or injury. Furthermore the show expects all animal handlers under the age of 16 to be accompanied at all times by a responsible adult when moving or showing animals at the show.

GENERAL NOTES

- a) Cattle showing signs of calving or aborting or which have any signs of discharge must be reported to the Society Veterinary surgeon immediately who will advise - the animal may be placed in isolation and returned to its herd of origin. The animal will not be allowed to enter.
- b) No animal will be admitted to the Show unless accompanied by the correct papers.
— All livestock must be accompanied by their passport and have followed movement licensing and testing requirements current at the time of travelling to and from the show.
- (c) Herd Book No. and Name of animal must be submitted for pedigree animals on entry form.
- (d) Substitutes will be allowed, subject to details of the substituted animals being provided by telephone before Show Day.

SPECIAL BIO-SECURITY REGULATIONS

Applicable to Sheep and Cattle Classes and Poultry Classes.

1. Clean clothing, or clothing which is capable of being cleansed and disinfected, must be worn.
2. All livestock must be returned to the originating holding at the end of the Show.
3. All exhibitors must arrange the licenses appropriate to the rules in force at the time of the Show.
4. The public must not touch the animals.
5. No person will leave the animal area without cleansing and disinfecting their footwear.
6. Livestock vehicles that are not being fully cleansed and disinfected on the premises must remain within the animal area.
7. No vehicle or person will enter or leave the animal area visibly contaminated with animal faeces.

ONLINE SHOW CLASSES

We are running a number of online classes this year too.

These are:

1. Wensleydale through your eyes – a video/ film/ picture compilation lasting maximum 2 minutes un-narrated that shows the public everything that is good about the region with emphasis on the role of farming and the show in the area.
2. A narrated video and featuring an under 18- with their pet or farm animals – showing their knowledge and care of the animal – max 2 minutes.
3. A picture showing a bale or scarecrow that promotes Wensleydale Show to passers by.
4. A picture/ video to show the building/ creation of a lockdown upcycling project, with explanation on the how/why/ what's been used to create it. Video to be a maximum of 2 minutes.
5. The best food from Wensleydale – a short video (max 2 minutes) showing clips from the recipe creation by the chef.

HORSE AND PONY CLASSES

No entries accepted on the day

Horses and Ponies must only be ridden in the designated areas.

On arrival, please report to the Horse Steward's tent by the Horse and Pony rings to collect your numbers

All horses to be accompanied by passports and have current equine influenza vaccination - Standard advice is that vaccines should be up to date and best practice is that they have had a booster within twelve months of their attendance at the Show to be safe as possible.

Ridden horses and ponies must be over 4 years of age.

No Colts or Stallions Allowed

Hard hats to the current safety standard are to be worn at all times when mounted and stewards will check hats if deemed necessary. If they are found not to be of the current safety standard, you will be asked to dismount and not continue until a suitable hat is worn. If you do not ride due to incorrect hat wear, your entry fee will not be refunded. We also recommend that hats are worn for in-hand classes. It is also recommended that body protectors are worn for U16s.

Fallers will only be allowed to remount at the Chief Stewards discretion.

Lead rein ponies must have snaffle bridles and the lead rein attached to the noseband or a y-coupling.

Occasionally, classes may be split or amalgamated according to entries and times are subject to change but classes will not start before the times shown.

NB. No refunds for competitors missing a class or in the rare event of a rider being unseated. Joining or re-joining a class once it has started and the gate is closed is at the Chief Steward's discretion- if you anticipate there will be an issue with classes clashing and you may need assistance; please let a Steward know when you collect your number. Class times are published in the Schedule.

Please follow stewards' instructions as safety is paramount. Any horse or human acting in a dangerous or abusive manner will be asked to leave without recompense. No excessive ringside coaching. Thank you.

The Judge's decision is final and any trophies are awarded at the judges' discretion.

225g unsalted butter
Zest of 1 lemon
1 tsp vanilla essence
225g caster sugar
4 eggs
225g self raising flour
1 tsp baking powder
1 tbsp semi skimmed milk

Filling

75g unsalted butter
125g icing sugar
1 tsp lemon juice
3 tbsp Co-op lemon curd

Topping

250g icing sugar
1 tbsp lemon curd
1 lemon zested into fine strips

Method

180°C/ fan 160°C/Gas 4

Cake 2 x 220cm Sandwich tins – greased and lined

Place lemon zest, vanilla essence, butter and caster sugar in a bowl, beat until light and fluffy. Gradually add beaten eggs and a little flour. Fold in remaining flour plus baking powder. Add milk, divide between the prepared sandwich tins. Bake approx. 20mins - cool

Prepare Filling

Cream together butter, icing sugar and lemon juice. Spread one cake with the lemon curd and spread the other with the butter cream, sandwich together.

Topping

Combine the icing sugar with 40 ml cold water add the lemon juice. Spoon over the cake allow to trickle down the sides. Decorate with the strips of lemon zest.

Bake for 10-12 minutes. Allow to cool and harden before removing from baking trays. While warm they may be curled like brandy snaps.
